### **Nomination Statement**

I'm nominating Jennifer Reyna as the City of Fresno Disability Advisory Commission's Achievement of the Year Award recipient for 2019. 'Jenn', as she is known, is the Manager and Coach of the only wheelchair basketball team in the central San Joaquin Valley, the Central Valley Ballers. The closest other wheelchair basketball teams are in Sacramento and San Jose. The team was established in 2014 with a coach, Bao and borrowed basketball wheelchairs. Jenn assumed management responsibilities of finding a practice venue, organizing weekly practice, public relations and tournament logistics for the team. After their coach accepted a position in Washington DC., Jenn also assumed responsibilities of coaching as well. After initiating the process, Jenn was able to obtain non-profit organization status with a 501 (c) 3 tax exemption for the team. Therefore, I'm nominating Jenn in the categories of Improving the quality of life for individuals with disabilities as she accomplished this by helping establish the team, managing it and making it a non-profit

organization; Advocacy for issues pertaining to individuals with disabilities, she advocates for the team by being the spokesperson, grant writer and manager as well as coach; Volunteerism that has a positive impact on individuals with disabilities, she has achieved all of this as a volunteer; Development of new programs or services impacting individuals with disabilities, again, helped establish and has continued to support the teams existence; and Innovation or Entrepreneurship by an individual with a disability or that has a positive impact on individuals with disabilities, Jenn wrote a grant obtaining additional equipment for the team so people who can't afford a basketball wheelchair are able to play. This year Jenn wrote a grant to the Christopher and Dana Reeves Foundation asking for five new basketball wheelchairs for those who aren't able to play as they can't afford one and for a trailer to house and transport them in. The Foundation contacted Jenn that her grant application was accepted and the team would be granted new basketball wheelchairs and a trailer. These are incredible feats that Jenn has accomplished with the help of her husband, team player Raul and their teammates. Jennifer holds a Bachelors degree in Education from California State University Fresno and is an Autism Specialist/Para Educator for the Fresno Unified School District. She and Raul reside in Fresno. It is for all of these reasons I'm nominating Jennifer Reyna as the 2019 DAC Achievement Award recipient for the City of Fresno Disability Advisory Commission.
