A complete street is a transportation facility that is planned, designed, operated and maintained to provide safe mobility for all users while connecting to a larger transportation network

Complete Streets Policy

- Purpose to solidify current City practices and ensure consistency in the application. Strengthen City grant applications.
- Policy to aid in the planning, design, and construction of transportation facilities to balance safety, access, and mobility for users of all abilities and ages.
- * **Vision** to create a complete street wherever feasible.
- Priority as identified in the Active Transportation Plan (ATP), including prioritization of projects per the tools previously adopted by Council.
- Commitment every development and city transportation improvement shall be approached as an opportunity to create safer, more accessible streets for all users.

Exceptions to Complete Streets Elements Director Approval

- * Where prohibited by law or adopted City Plan
- * Ordinary Maintenance or Emergency Repair Activities
- * Parcel is Developable
- Project Funding Source is Restricted
- Funding for Complete Streets improvements allocated within 5 years
- Postponement will not be contrary to Public Health & Safety or detrimental to Orderly Development

Exceptions to Complete Streets Elements City Council Approval

- Cost to Establish Walkways or Bikeways
 Disproportionate to Project Costs (Exceeding 20%)
- * Absence of Both a Current & Future Need

Exceptions to Complete Streets Elements Planning Commission

 Planning Commission retains full authority to approve, modify and/or delete conditions of approval, including those identified in this Complete Streets Policy.

Complete Streets Policy Implementation

- * Ten (10) Implementation Measures included in the Complete Streets Policy.
- * Annual performance measurements to be reported to the Council.
- Appointed BPAC representatives to meet, at minimum, annually with their respective Councilmember or Mayor to discuss needs and goals.
