WHEREAS, the Fresno Police Department's "Bringing Broken Neighborhoods

Back to Life" program (the Program) has operated for seventeen years in Southwest Fresno, and is headquartered in the Southwest Policing District; and

WHEREAS, since 2002, the Program has hosted 426 block parties, and averages 30 outreach events a year; and

WHEREAS, over 100,000 people have attended Program events since its inception; and

WHEREAS, there are dozens of faith-based and community-based organizations associated with the Program; and

WHEREAS, "Santa's Village" has been part of the Program since its inception, and averages 3,000 people per year, the majority of which are kids with single mothers; and

WHEREAS, the Program is a strong example of community policing and community engagement in the City.
