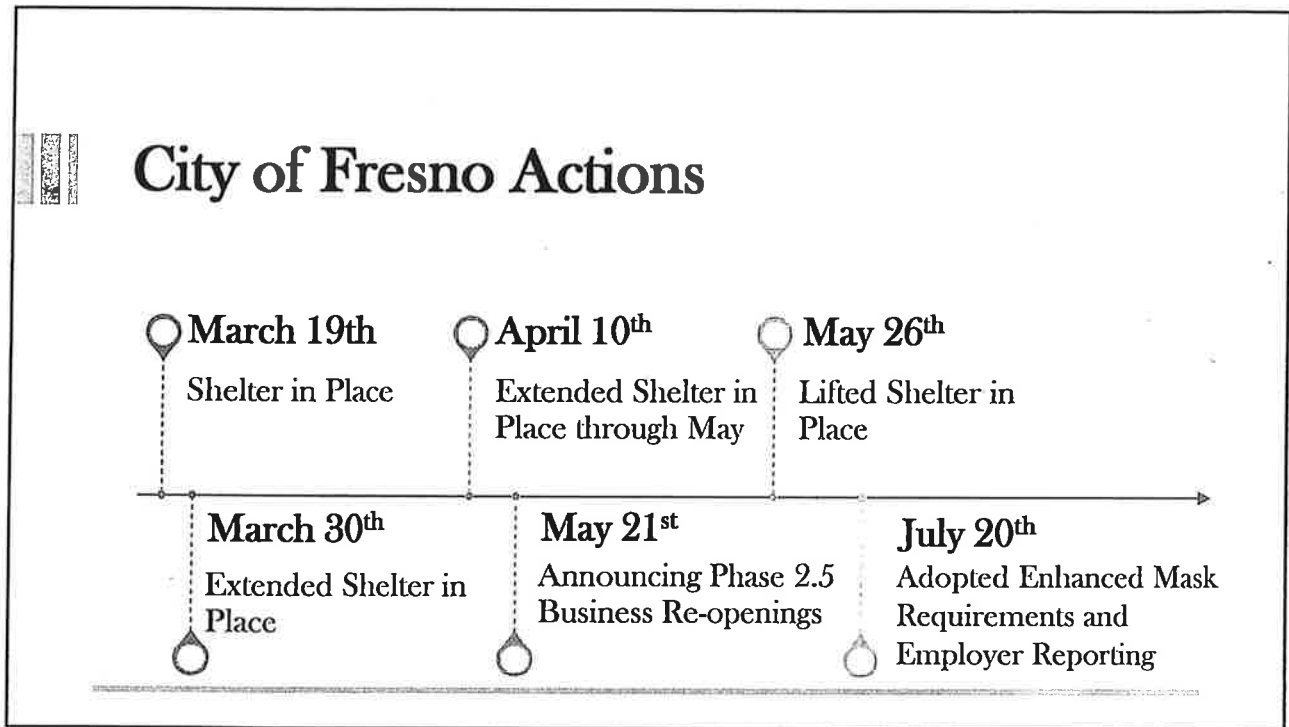

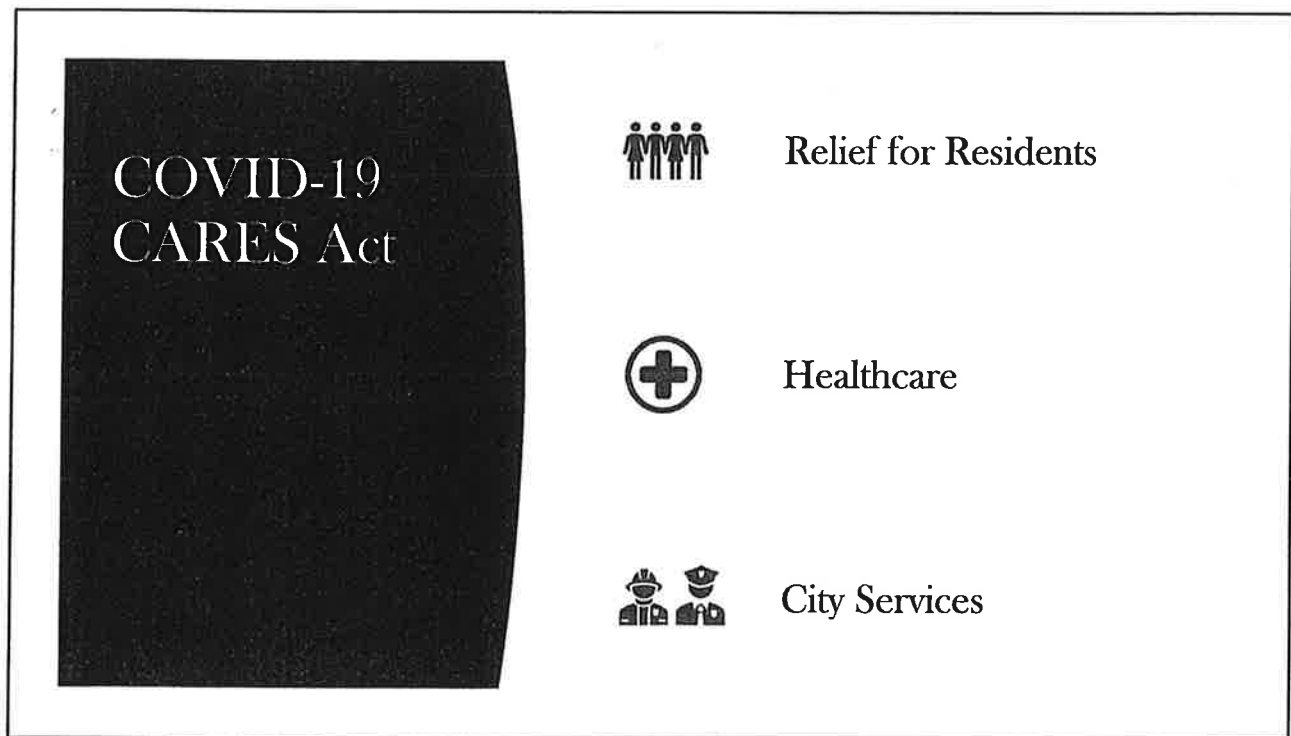

Relief for Residents and Businesses \$25.5 million

Housing Retention Grants - \$5 Million

- \$1.5 million in process now; more to be allocated in August

Food Assistance - \$5 Million

- In planning stages

Homeless Transitional Housing - \$1.5 Million

- In planning stages, may be combined with Project Homekey and other programs and agencies to provide greater benefits

Parks, Community Center, Arts & Culture - \$1 Million

- In planning stages

Relief for Residents and Businesses \$25.5 million (continued)

Save Our Small Business Grants - \$4 Million

- \$2.75 million expended; more to be allocated in August

Childcare Vouchers for Essential Workers - \$2.1 Million

- Central Valley Children's Services Network program is underway

Micro Farmers Farm to Family Grant Program - \$500,000

- \$500,000 Expended

Safe Business Practices Education - \$110,000

- \$110,000 Expended

Healthcare \$20 million

Health Clinics for Southwest & Southeast Fresno - \$10 Million

- In planning stages

Mobile Heal COVID-19 Testing & Health Screening - \$5 Million

- City has contracted with UCSF for three Mobile Heal testing and screening vehicles to be deployed in Southeast and Southwest Fresno

Expanded Testing Capability - \$3 Million

- In planning stages

Contact Tracing - \$2 Million

- In planning stages

City Services for the Residents of the City of Fresno \$9.25 Million

Retrofit City Facilities - \$4.25 Million

- Retrofit City facilities with touchless restroom fixtures, social distancing, barriers for public counters, signage and other improvements to create a safer environment for City employees and Fresno residents who need to visit City buildings

Telework Technology Upgrade - \$2 Million

- Expand the ability of City employees to telework and provide efficient service to the residents of Fresno

Current & Future City Expenses - \$2 Million

- Eligible City Expenses not covered in other specific line items

PPE Purchasing - \$1 Million

- Ongoing purchases of PPE for City staff, small businesses and others who are in need

Preservation of Essential City Services \$38 Million

Citywide Salaries Related to COVID-19 Mitigation - \$25 Million

- \$9 million in Fiscal Year 2020 and \$16 million in the first half of Fiscal Year 2021 for salaries of City employees who have provided services to City residents to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19 on the community

Contingency - \$13 Million

- Contingency for other eligible expenses or if Congress allows local governments to use these funds for revenue replacement
