*Richard Dale Keyes Sr. Day*

**WHEREAS**, Richard Dale Keyes Sr. was born in Columbus, Ohio to Roy and Erma Keyes; and

**WHEREAS**, While a youth, Keyes was inquisitive and found intrigue in any challenge, all while being inspired by his mother to develop ethical values and to become involved by serving the community; and

**WHEREAS**, During the 70's, he was encouraged by the Fresno State Black Student Union to establish the university's first ethnic studies program; and

**WHEREAS**, Keyes became Fresno State's first Black Studies Chair and implemented the first Equal Opportunity Program that was vital for minority recruitment; and

**WHEREAS**, Through the University of California, Santa Cruz, he traveled extensively, both nationally and internationally, developing community-based health programs with an emphasis on global indigenous populations; and

**WHEREAS**, Following retirement in 2002, he became active on various Fresno community boards such as the Fresno Economic Opportunities Commission, Southwest Fresno Development Corporation, Fresno Metro Black Chamber and Fresno Regional Workforce Development Board; and

**WHEREAS**, On September 27, 2020, after a lifetime of service to family and community, Keyes passed away at the age of 85.

In the City of Fresno.


